Bob was born in Germany and raised in Tonawanda, NY where he attended Kenmore East SR. High School. Bob was active in the Army for 6 years where he was a helicopter pilot. He was discharged as a disabled Veteran. We'd like to thank Bob for his service. He has since retired from the US Postal Service after 30 years. He is currently living in Henrietta.

Bob has been single since 2009 but he has the love of his dog Ranger which he got in October at 8 weeks old after losing his beloved dog Oreo in June. Oreo live a great life with Bob for 12 years. Both Oreo and Ranger are Tri Color Shelties (black and white). They are beautiful dogs.

In 1973 Bob bought his first Corvette, a 1969 convertible. It had no engine and no transmission. He worked on it till he went into the Military in 1975 and sold it. In 2011 he purchased a 1982 Collector's Edition-which he still has and has 38,000 original miles on it. He then bought a 1991 C4 Coupe. One of only 200 built (metallic turquoise). He also purchased a 2004 C5 triple black. In 2018 Bob traded the 1991 C4 Coupe along with the C5 triple black for a 2016 Z51Stingray triple black. Get to know your new Vice President-Gil Alexander

Gil has been a Corvette owner since 2015 when he traded his 2007 Mustang convertible for a 1993 torch red Corvette convertible at Turner Corvettes in Victor. He is on his 4th Corvette today, a 2021 torch red coupe with the license plate POPS ONE. In the meantime, he had a 1999 magnetic red Corvette convertible and a 2009 crystal red metallic Corvette convertible. Gil joined the Rochester Covette Club that first year in 2015.

In 2017, he retired as an Information Technology Project Management Professional from Harris RF Communications. He joined Xerox Corporation as a college Co-op from Rchester Institute of Technology in 1972. He was hired full-time upon graduation with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration and remained for 22 years until he was outsourced to Electronic Data Systems in 1994. Gil stayed at EDS for 12 years until 2006 when my job was outsourced to India. I remained unemployed for 18 months when I was hired as a contract employee for Harris RF Communications in 2008. After 10 months in 2009, he was offered a full-time position and remained until he turned 66 and retired in 2017. He states he has never looked back.

Gil is the father of three grown children, who all live in the area and five grandchildren just beginning their adult lives. He has been divorced from his children's mother since 2000 after being together for 30 years. In 2003, he remarried for three years and have been single since 2006. Gil lives in the 19th Ward of the City of Rochester in the home that he purchased in 1977. His children graduated from Wilson Magnet High School where Gil's mother attended when it was West High School.

Gil was born in his grandmother's house six blocks from his current home and was baptized in the original Emanual Lutheran Church on Thurston Road. His parents were also married in that Church. His parents bounced between Rochester and Syracuse in his early years and settled in Fairmount just west of Syracuse in 1959. He lived there until 1969 when he graduated from West Genesee Sr. High and over the next two years got a AAS degree from SUNY at Delhi, got married to his high school sweetheart, and we had their first daughter. Upon graduation, they moved to Rochester to complete his education. Their second daughter came 22 months later and their son 6 years later.

Gil has had a fascination with auto racing since he saw his first stock car race at the age of 11. None of his three brothers nor sister ever shared his interest. Since 1972, he has been an avid local auto racing "fan in the stands". In 1998, he was offered the opportunity to scrape mud off a DIRT Modified. That lead him into the pits where a new promoter that he knew from Xerox invited him to become a pit steward. He eventually became a corner flagger and did one season as an assistant starter at Canandaigua Speedway. In February of 2004, he suffered two heart attacks. One of the stents that was placed on Superbowl Sunday occluded six days later. He no longer had the strength to climb into the starters tower. For the next two years he became the voice in the driver's helmet as he manned the one-way radio from the tower. The track management changed hands and his services were no longer required. For two years he worked at Genesee Speedway in Batavia. Since 2012, he has worked with the local 360 and 305 sprint cars of the Patriot Sprint Tour and CRSA Sprint Tour. Last December, he retired to devote his time and energy for the next two years to the Rochester Corvette Club as our Vice President.

Gil finally got the opportunity to realize his dream of driving fast on a racetrack. In October of 2021, he attended the Ron Fellows New Corvette Owners School at Spring Mountain in Neveda. He stated- It was more fun than

you should be allowed to have. For the last two years he has driven his 2021 Stingray with the Niagara Region Porche Club at their High-Performance Drivers Education events at Watkins Glen International.

Gil highly recommends that you experience all that the Corvette has to offer. They are truly an amazing car! As Vice President this year and President next year, Gil plan to continue the success of the Rochester Corvette Club. We have a 65-year tradition of fun, fellowship, education, giving, and support to those who are passionate about our favorite automobile, the Chevrolet Corvette.


Convention Center Auto Show

The result was this rather silly looking 1967 Corvette. That's famed GM designer Chuck Jordan sitting on the hood of the Batvette. The modded Corvette's most prominent features were its not very practical circular rear spoiler, stick-on Bat logos, hood-mounted machine guns, and an enormous 427 engine protruding through its hood.
